


## How to Manage Multiple Screens on Macintosh and Windows

This article covers how to manage multiple screens on Macintosh and Windows.

Windows

On Windows, you can use the keyboard shortcut  +  (Windows Key + P) to bring up the display picker that gives you the option to select one of the following display modes:

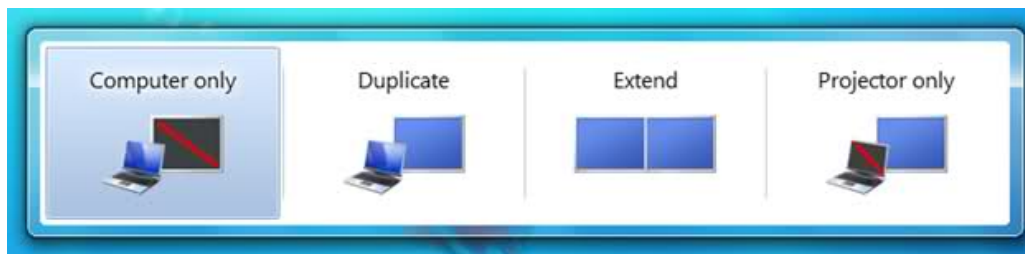
**Computer/PC screen only** - The second screen is ignored and only the PC's primary display is used.

**Duplicate** - The second screen mirrors the primary display.

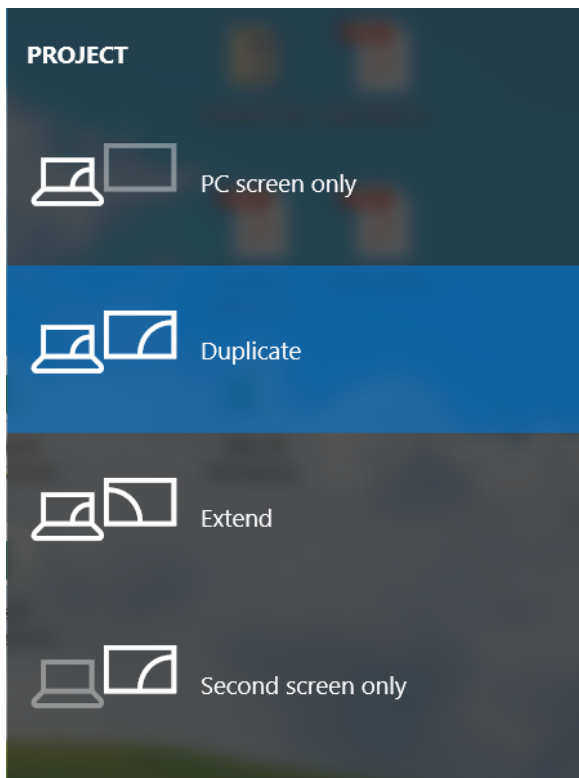
**Extend** - The PC display is extended across all screens.

**Projector/Second screen only** - The main PC display will be disabled and only the secondary screen is used.
