

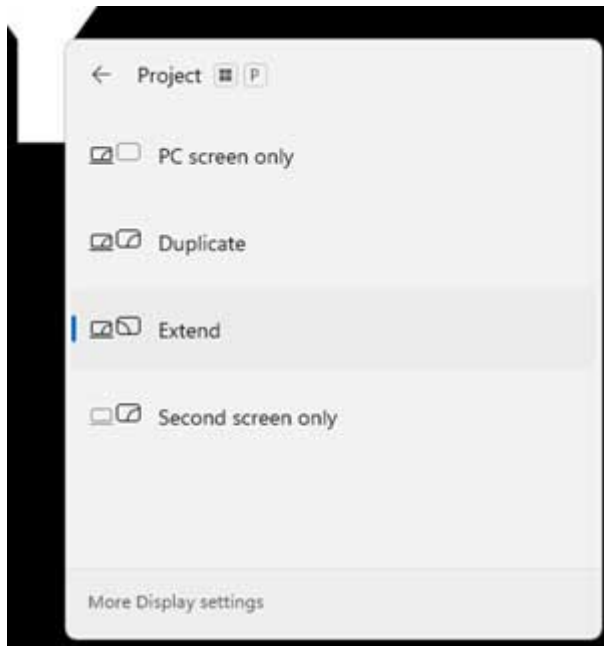
## How to Manage Multiple Screens on Macintosh and Windows

This article covers how to manage multiple screens on Macintosh and Windows.

### Windows

On Windows, you can use the keyboard shortcut (Windows Key + P) to bring up the display picker that gives you the option to select one of the following display modes:



**Computer/PC screen only** - The second screen is ignored and only the PC's primary display is used.

**Duplicate** - The second screen mirrors the primary display.

**Extend** - The PC display is extended across all screens.

**Projector/Second screen only** - The main PC display will be disabled and only the secondary screen is used.

### Macintosh

On Macintosh, you can use the keyboard shortcut **Command + F1** to mirror or extend your displays. To configure more advanced multiple-display options, consult this [Apple support article](#).
