## **Powerwash and Enterprise Enroll Chromebooks.**

These instructions will go over what you will need to do to Powerwash (Factory Reset) for Chromebooks.

To enable **Powerwash** make sure that you are currently *signed out* of any account that is currently logged into the device.

- Press CTRL+SHIFT+ALT+R to bring up the Powerwash screen.
- A box will come up to confirm **Powerwash**. Click **Continue**.



- The device will *restart* to **Powerwash** and go through the *first time setup* again.
- After Selecting your **network**, you will be taken to a screen that refers to **Enterprise Enrollment** being completed.
- You will know when the **Chromebook** is properly **enrolled** when you see "**Managed by SOU**" on the *sign-in* page.



## How to update without signing in.

- If you would like to do more you can **update** *WITHOUT* signing in.
- Click the **Browse as Guest** button.
